Bruce Soifer, photographer and digital artist, lives in Dayton, Ohio. He received a Bachelor's Degree from Ohio University, Athens, Ohio, with a major in business and minor in painting. He took up photography and self—taught through books, periodicals, seminars, online classes, and other media; member of DVAC 5 years, Tripod Camera Club 4 years, National Association of Photoshop Professionals 6 years and a member of Professional Photographers of America.

Participated in shows throughout Miami Valley cities (Dayton, Kettering, Piqua, and Troy), including Dayton Visual Arts Center Shows. Many pieces sold through DVAC Auctions and Member Shows. Volunteers for Piqua Arts Council.

"Light has been the driving force in my art. I observe the direction it comes from, the color, the way it is reflected off different surfaces, or how light passes through materials, and the shadows it creates to show texture. I like to print on different materials, matching the image captured to what fits best. "

COMPETITION NOTE

For the purpose of the special competition, a still life is defined as a collection of objects in a variety of colors and textures arranged and lit by the photographer, Found scenes are not allowed. Found scenes include but are not limited to museum displays, store displays and statues. Plays on the title Still Life, such as bourbon stills and "life" that is still, are also not allowed. Since this is the specialty category, your entry should be minimally edited, mostly straight out of camera, as all our categories except extended are.
