Nov 11 — "Lightroom: Start to Finish" Laura James Shares Her Process

We are pleased to welcome Laura James as our program presenter for the November meeting. She will share her expertise and rationale for loading, editing, and organizing photos with Lightroom.

A little background: Laura's been shooting for about 15 years, has progressed from a point and shoot camera to technically advanced full frame DSLR equipment. She says her favorite subjects are trees, but that fog is what grabs her, always.

She describes a new effort, ". . . working in a darkroom using my digital images to make negatives. Doing both platinum palladium and most recently silver gelatin. Currently working on a series of images of Spirit Women where I am using a blending technique to create images with a woman superimposed on a background image. I will bring with me several of these images."

Laura has had a photo accepted by a gallery in SoHo NYC; two copies were sold. She says that feels like her biggest accomplishment. She also won best of show several years ago at the Middletown Art Center and has had images hung at Wash Art Park Gallery and Manifest Gallery in Cincinnati.

The optional competition theme for the month adds a challenge, or maybe an incentive, for the photographers. 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention places are recognized in each category. Points based on placement level are accumulated towards End-of-Year awards.

"Winning" aside, we all benefit from seeing each others' work. Participation is a great opportunity for honing technique, stepping outside of usual subject arena, building a critical eye.

A qualified member (dues must have been paid in advance, the member must be present at the meeting*) may enter up to 4 photos per month but no more than 2 per category. Digital entries must be uploaded by 11:59 pm on the Monday prior to the monthly meeting. Print entries must be signed in at the meeting no later than 7:15.
